CSU Transferability

Local Curriculum Committee Approval

Delegated to CCC by CSU Executive Order 167

Comparable Courses are local policy

If No Comparable Course, Course Must:

- Enhance “understanding of analytical, scientific, or cultural concepts and traditions.”
- Emphasize “understanding [of] the theories and concepts that underlie practice.”





Comparable Courses

Debunking Fact From
Fiction

Used to Validate:

- UC Transferability
- Prerequisites

Not Required For:

- Validating CSU Transferability
- Justifying CSU GE or IGETC Approval

June, July, or August 25th Deadline

Appeals in October

Reviewed by the UCOP

Courses are Backdated

Governed by Specific Regulations





UC TCA

University of California Office of the President

Regulations Include:

- The course should be comparable to one offered at the lower-division at a UC Campus
- If the course is not equivalent to a UC course, it must be appropriate for a university degree in terms of purpose, scope, and depth.

Expanding University Transfer

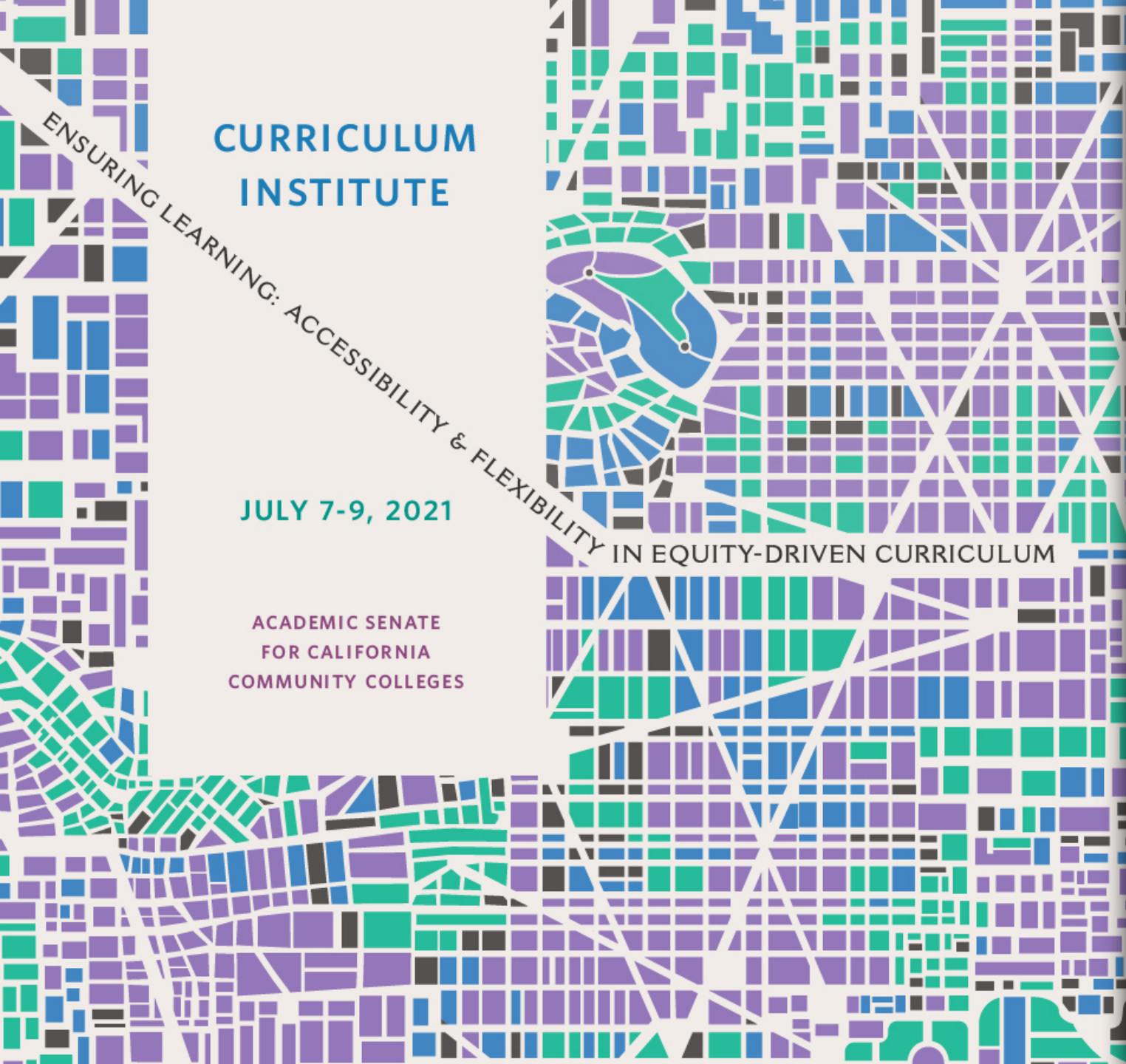
Many international universities are open to articulation agreements

Some have US Regional Accreditation





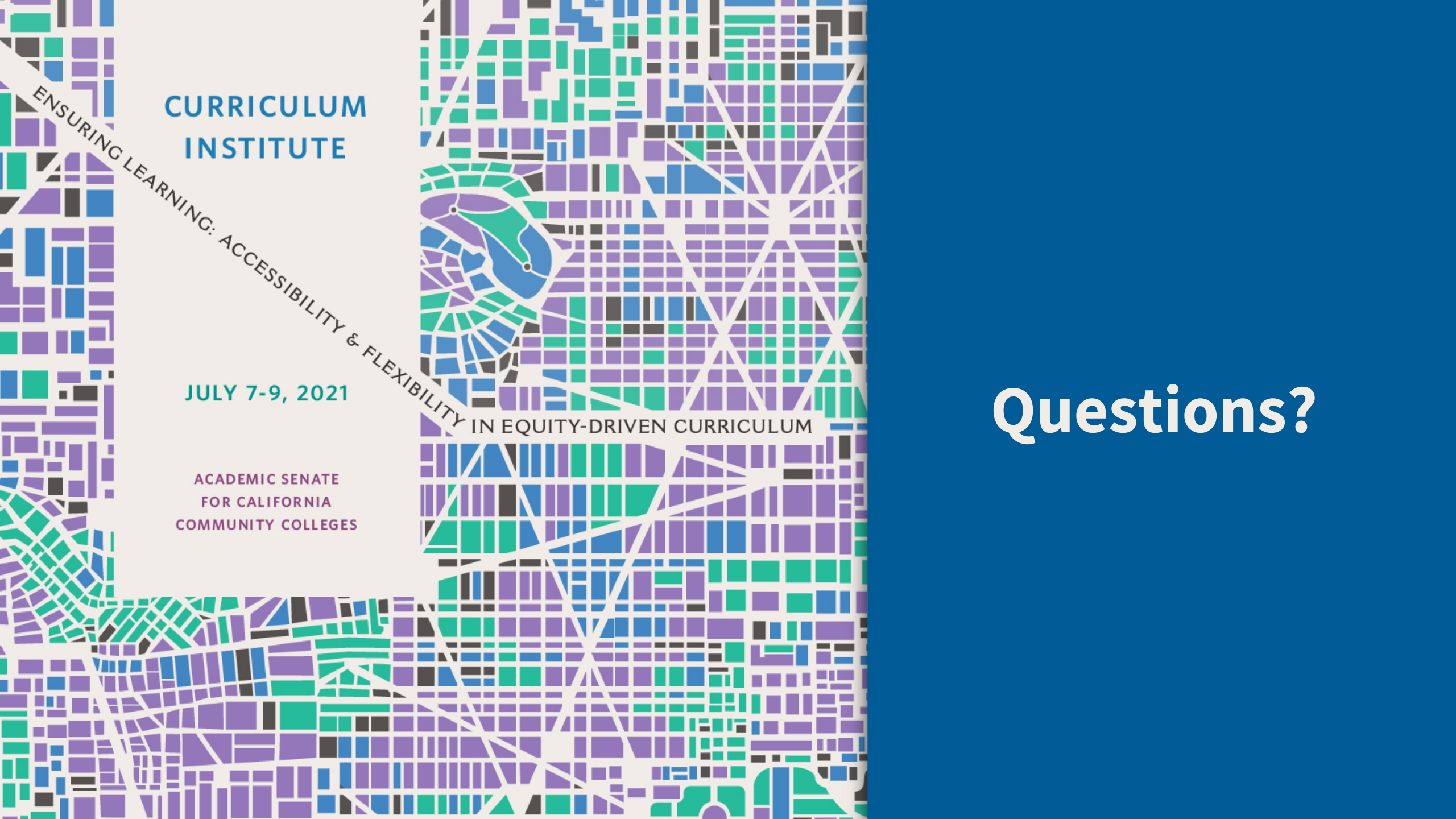
