History

Senate Bill 850



- In September 2014, Governor Jerry Brown signed Senate Bill 850 (Block) into law. This legislation allowed up to 15 community colleges to be selected as baccalaureate offering institutions.
- The Chancellor's Office received 34 applications to participate in the Bachelor's Degree Program.
- By May 2015 the Board of Governors approved the **15** Bachelor's Degree Program colleges.

Current Legislation

- **Pending – Senate Bill 769**

- Extend pilot program until July 1, 2028 and no longer require a student to complete his or her degree by the end of the 2022-2023 academic year.
- ~~Increase the maximum number of district baccalaureate degree pilot programs to 25 programs.~~
- ~~Require each district offering a new baccalaureate degree pilot program on or after January 1, 2018 to use its existing financial resources to implement the program by no later than the 2020-2021 academic year.~~

Current Pilot Colleges

- These may be the only publically funded bachelor's degrees of their kind in the state of California.
- As such, it is incumbent upon the college to ensure they serve the needs of the state balanced by the the local needs of the community
- Now that all 15 programs are established, we need to focus on the larger issue of the state and the transfer students throughout California

Current Pilot Colleges

- **Barriers/Challenges**

- Creating comparable upper-division courses between pilots
- Creating comparable lower division major courses
- Reviewing of foreign transcripts
- Incorporating lower division major courses between community colleges on ASSIST.ORG
- Incorporating upper division articulation between community colleges and UC/CSU campuses on ASSIST.ORG
