Statutory Authority

Student Transfer Achievement Reform (STAR) Act (CEC Section 66745-66749)

- 66746(b)(1)(B) by Fall 2015, CCCs need to create an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) in majors SB440 offered by that college for any Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) approved prior to 2013-14 academic year.
- $5B144\overline{0}$ 66746(b)(1)(C) within 18 months, CCCs need to create ADTs in majors offered by that college for any TMCs approved after 2013-14.



 C-ID Descriptors, submits and monitors courses through the C-ID review
 process and secure applicable ASSIST reports.
- Counselors: Provide input on major and GE unit requirements and facilitate communication of new degree requirements and benefits to students.
- Administrators: Ensure compliance with California Ed Code and Program and Course Approval Handbook (PCAH) 5th Edition Appendix B; oversee submission of proposal to CCC Chancellor's Office.



Item 1. Statement of Program Goals and Objectives

- ✓ Stipulates the primary focus of the law: to assist students in seamlessly transferring to a CSU to complete a baccalaureate degree in a specific TMC discipline or similar major.
- ✓ May include the program level Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs).
- ✓ If the ADT program goal selected is "Career Technical Education (CTE) and Transfer" include the specific entry-level occupation(s) or field(s) the program will prepare students to enter and the basic occupational competencies students will acquire.

Item 2. Catalog Description

- ✓ An overview of the knowledge and skills students will demonstrate upon completion.
- ✓ Includes **Associate Degree for Transfer requirements** pursuant to Education Code:
 - Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University.
 - The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education – Breadth Requirements.
 - A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
 - Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0."
 - A grade of "C" or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.
- ✓ If the ADT program goal selected is "Career Technical Education (CTE) and Transfer" list the potential entry-level careers students may enter upon completion.

Item 3. Program Requirements

✓ Optional— Some colleges include a response as it allows the Chancellor's Office reviewers to recognize the requirements/restrictions not easily discernible on the TMC Templates.

EXAMPLE

Anthropology TMC: To assist their students in being better prepared for transfer, some colleges have elected to include the Statistics course as part of the Required Core when it is listed as an option in List A.

Proposals submitted before June 30, 2015 still need to have an acceptable C-ID status (i.e., Submitted/Resubmitted, Approved, Conditional, In Progress).*





Double-Counting



Double-Counting

- California Code of Regulations, title5,
 § 55063. Minimum Requirements for the Associate Degree.
 - (c) While a course might satisfy more than one general education requirement, it may not be counted more than once for these purposes. A course may be used to satisfy both a general education requirement and a major or area of emphasis requirement. Whether it may be counted again for a different degree requirement is a matter for each college to determine.

Double-Counting

- Must account for the <u>ASSIST minimum</u> number of units that may be double-counted for each GE (IGETC or CSU-GE) area, not the course unit value assigned by the college.
- *Note: CSU allows the maximum number of units for each GE area and the other units to be counted towards transferable electives up until the transferable unit cap is reached.
- Exception: CSU GE Area B3, 1 unit will be assigned if there is a lab
 in B1 or B2 and if the total for Area B comes to 10 it will be allowed
 by CCCCO.
- Courses can only be double counted in one GE Area.
- The Biology & Chemistry TMCs require the completion of the CSU-GE Breadth or IGETC for <u>STEM</u> GE pattern (33 units CSU-GE, 31 units IGETC).

Double Counting Guidelines from Dave DeGroot

Double Counting Calculation Steps

- Step 1 Add up all applicable GE double counting units.
- Step 2 Subtract the GE double counting units from the total transfer GE pattern units; 39 units for CSU GE or 37 units for IGETC.
- Step 3 Add the result of Step 2 and the major units together.
- Step 4 If the total is less than 60 units, then the number of units left to reach 60 units are the number of elective units available for the transfer degree.




