- Critique, with respect and humility, not maliciousness
- When an issue or conflict arises, engage individuals directly to resolve the issue or conflict.

- Be a trusted ally who can be a sounding board and will help you redirect negativity into positive action.
- Recognize that we are more than one opinion or position and avoid labeling or stereotyping someone based on past decisions or opinions

Legislative Changes since 8 June 2019

AB2 (Santiago) – Referred to the Committee on Education (12 June 2019).

AB30 (Holden) – In committee; referred to Appropriations Suspense File (24 June 2019).

AB130 (Low) – Amended on 3 June 2019 to reflect SB3 (Allen, 2019) to include three faculty, one from each segment from a list provided to the governor by the respective Academic Senates, on the advisory committee. ASCCC position changes from oppose to support – letter sent to Low's office 6 June 2019. Hearing cancelled at request of office (4 June 2019)

AB239 (Salas) – CCC Nursing Programs. Passed out of Appropriations (24 June 2019).

AB302 (Berman). Significant amendments were made to this bill, including: "Provide for a campus to opt-out from the bill's provisions by specifying the bill's provisions do not apply if the community college is addressing issues for students who are experiencing homelessness by implementing all of the following activities on or before April 1, 2020:

- 1. Provides emergency grants that are necessary to secure housing or to prevent the imminent loss of housing.
- 2. Dispenses hotel vouchers through a public agency or community organization.
- 3. Provides homeless students with rapid re-housing referral services. "

With these changes, the League has taken an official oppose position on the bill.

AB595 (Medina) – Ordered to third reading 11 June 2019)

AB1314 (Medina) – Cal Grant Reform Act. Along with SB291 (Leyva), this has been turned into a 2 year bill for the authors to collaborate on. (20 June 2019)

AB1460 (Weber) – Amended to read: "The bill, commencing with the 2020–21 academic year, would require the California State University to require, as an undergraduate graduation requirement, the completion-of of, at minimum, one 3-unit course in ethnic studies, as specified." Re-referred to Committee on Education (17 June 2019).

AB1658 (Carrillo) – Teacher Credentialing – Referred to Committee on Appropriatioons (24 June 2019)

AB1727 (Weber) – Referred to Committee on Education (12 June 2019).

AB1729 (Smith) – Referred to Committee on Education (12 June 2019).

SB3 (Allen) -- Referred to Assembly Committee in Higher Education

SB291 (Leyva). Along with AB1314 (Medina), this has been turned into a 2 year bill for the authors to collaborate on. (20 June 2019)

SB462 (Stern) – Author amended bill enough that ASCCC withdrew its oppose position; letter sent to the author's office to that effect. Re-referred to Committee on Higher Education (13 June 2019).

SB484 (Portantino) – Auto-award of Degrees>. Re-referred to the Committee on Higher Education (11 June 2019)

SB563 (Roth) –CCAP Pilot. Referred to Committees on Education and Higher Education (10 June 2019)

 - The California Science Project (CSP) is a statewide support network for teacher professional learning and leadership development.
 - Our programs align with the California's education priorities adopted by the State Board of Education and the new regulations of the federal <u>Every Student Succeeds Act</u> (ESSA) legislation passed in 2015.
 - The CSP is organized in regional sites housed in science departments of universities and independent colleges throughout California.
 - The CSP collaborates with science faculty, educators, schools and districts to provide effective
 and high quality science instruction, with a special focus on the needs of English learners,
 students in poverty, and students with low literacy.
 - The CSP is part of the larger infrastructure of discipline-specific networks known as the
 <u>California Subject Matter Project</u> administered by the University of California, Office of the
 President.
 - Maria C. Simani, UCR Physics Professor, is the Executive Director since 2011.
- 2. Advisory Board Members Provide Support to the California Science Project

Primary Responsibilities

- Review and make recommendations on proposals, scope of work, interim reports and annual budget for each CSP Site and for CSP State Office.

CCC Canvas: active users - 1,154,230; active courses - 88,730

Ecosystem: proctored online exams - 139,285; students tutored online - 27,594; minutes of online tutoring for March 2019 - 248,640; online counseling appointments - 8,117; name pronunciations - 14,289

The Executive Team planning retreat focused on activities for 2019-20 with updated strategic themes of access, quality, completion, equity, and leadership. Conversations around the complete work plan are underway with guidance from the CCCCO. The focus will be on measurable progress with fewer objectives to allow for focused efforts and emphasis on core elements. RFA project clusters have been consolidated from 14 to five with a draft work plan in progress. Next steps include refining measurable outcomes and review of the draft work plan with the CCCCO.

Justin Schultz gave an update on Improving Online Pathways Grants and reported that 70 applications were selected for funding. Consortium colleges represented approximately 50% of the applications. Notifications will be done in June to prepare for grant award agreements. The deadline for appeals is June 14th and the intent is to begin awarding at the beginning of the new fiscal year.

LOCAL POCR

Autumn Bell advised that there are proposed name changes for the certificate in online course design fundamentals and the certificate in online teaching principles to reflect increased focus across the system before the Online Teaching

Conference (OTC). She reported that the focus over the coming years is to increase student access to high-quality online courses. A total of 224 courses have been aligned since 2015, and 96 of these have completed the Course Design Academy. In 2018-19, 122 courses were reviewed and 103 were aligned. Through year three of the current grant cycle, 589 courses have been aligned through the Course Design Academy. Two additional instructional designers have been hired and additional local POCR reviewers are needed to help meet the goal of 20% aligned courses. Autumn asked for guidance from the Advisory Committee to increase involvement. Jory advised that equity cohort colleges agreed to commit to aligning section inventory in the master consortium agreement. There was a group discussion on the quality of reviews and reviewers, rubric. norming, cost vs. value, and encouraging or incentivizing faculty participation.





May 2019 Progress and Plans - The primary focus of Year 1 is the initiation of a process of assessing needs by disciplines, securing and supporting local OER contacts, increasing OER awareness, and preparing for resource development.

- As we near the end of the spring 2019 term, the OERI Regional Leads have been verifying that the faculty OER Liaisons (OERLs) have completed their tasks for the term. OERLs who did so should be receiving their stipends by the end of the month.
 - Monthly OER and OERL newsletters distributed earlier this month.
- The weekly webinars initiated 2-1-19 (Fridays at 9:30) continue, with topics scheduled through May 17. The schedule is available on the ASCCC website or by using: tinyurl.com/ASCCC-OERIW

May 3	OER for Librarians - A Crash Course	Librarians are often the "go to" people for faculty considering OER. If you are in that role - or want to be in that role - what do you need to know? And how can you effectively help faculty on your campus?

These three webinars are a follow-up to an introductory webinar that introduced attendees to these platforms. In each of these one-hour sessions, a platform will be explored with a focus on the user experience. Topics to be addressed will include usability, accessibility, print options, attributions, available integrations, collaboration options, and interfacing with Canvas. Join us for one, two, or all three. Please note you must register for each webinar separately.

- The development of resources to facilitate expanding OER use at the local level is ongoing. Resources are available to all within a Canvas site available at: tinyurl.com/ASCCC-OERI. The site is intended to be a dynamic resource for OERLs and faculty with an interest in OER.
 - Cohort 2 survey distributed with a due date of May 31, 2019.
- Analysis of OER availability data to identify GE areas and required courses for Cohort
 degree and/or certificate attainment that lack OER and/or ancillary materials in progress. ZTC grantees recently surveyed.
- Explore available technology to meet OERI needs authoring/curating platforms were evaluate by OERI Leadership. Draft rubric was used to conduct an initial review of available technology. This initial review identified the 3 platforms that are the focus of the May 30 webinars for further analysis.
- Establish discipline-based resource collections and space for faculty dialogue under development within the Canvas site. The site is also being reorganized.
- Our "Request for Letters of Interest" yielded a robust response with over 60 letters received from faculty at over 33 of our colleges. Information obtained during this process was used to develop a request for proposals titled "Academic Senate for California Community Colleges Open Educational Resources Initiative (OERI) Summer and Fall 2019 Short-Term OER Development Projects" that is due at 5pm on May 30. The application is available at: tinyurl.com/ASCCC-OERI-May2019App. Reviewers will be convened the following week (June 4 and 5) and awardees will be notified by June 10.
- Awardees and other interested parties will be offered training and support for the use of one of three OER authoring/curation tools. The May 30 webinars noted above are intended to introduce the three platforms. Each platform will provide further "how to" training to interested CCC parties. A formal agreement has been established with Pressbooks to pilot its use at no-cost through December. The expectation is that our use of OER Commons will be limited to no-cost features and LibreTexts has no associated costs.
- Summer work will focus on supporting awardees and further development of the Canvas site.
- Review of My Open Math for accessibility by the CCC Tech Center is soon to be underway at the request of faculty from 3 colleges. OEI, LibreTexts, and OERI are all interested in identifying how we can expand the use of this homework system.
