

CCCCIO Executive Board report

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The CIO Board's goals this year remain the same: implement the priorities of the DEI Initiative, provide leadership on the Call to Action, and explore solutions to Title 5 regulatory hurdles. Other projects include revising our website and CIO Manual and creating a mentor program for new CIOs. We continue to meet every other week with members from the Chancellor's Office and look forward to our Spring Conference.

The conference will again take place at the San Francisco Hilton Financial District. The entire conference runs from Mon., April 11 from noon to Fri., April 15 noon. It begins with the Deans Academy and ALIVE from April 11 to April 13, followed by the main conference, April 13-15. The title of the spring conference is "Equitizing the Student Experience." It will include keynotes by Diego James Navarro (speaking on an organization he founded, the Academy for College Excellence, or ACE), Dr. Joshua Moon-Johnson (speaking on queer and trans advocacy in the community colleges), and Chancellor Eloy Oakley. Key topics are the DEI implementation, the Ethnic Studies Requirement, using the Launchboard for Institutional Improvement. The conference will be in-person only this spring, and we expect 100+ CIOs to attend. We are excited that the ASCCC and CCCCIO are collaborating on a pre-conference session DEI in Curriculum Model Principles and Practices; that will take place on Tuesday.
