# Finding Open Education Resources\*: Search Tips and Resource Suggestions

#### 1. What do you and your students need?

What do you need for your course? Textbooks are not the only OER materials. There are also open courses, data, assessment, lectures, etc.

### 2. Search an OER repository or collection.

- Searching by keyword might not return the best results
- Try browsing by discipline
- Use limiters (material type, education level, license type) to narrow down resources

## **3. Use Google Advanced Search:** https://www.google.com/advanced\_search

Then narrow your results by	
language:	any language
region:	any region
last update:	anytime
site or domain:	
terms appearing:	anywhere in the page
SafeSearch:	Show most relevant results
file type:	free to use share or modify
usage rights:	nee to use share of mounty

- Go to <u>Advanced Search</u> (search Google, look under settings, or bottom ofpage)
- 2. Type in keywords— to search .edu sites add Site:.edu in the keyword box
- Narrow results by usage rights choose "free to use, share, or modify"
- 4. You will need to verify license and determine exact terms of use
