ISSUE

California community colleges received \$200M to implement the Strong Workforce Program and meet their local and regional workforce needs. The Workforce and Economic Development Division created a comprehensive technical assistance menu of offerings for colleges and constituents to ensure the ongoing success of this investment.

BACKGROUND

California's economic competitiveness is fueled, in part, by the strength of its regional economies and its skilled workforce. Upward social and economic mobility helps keep the state's economy diversified and vibrant. The attainment of industry-valued "middle skill credentials" serves as a gateway for a large and diverse number of careers in the state's economy. The Strong Workforce Program was established to expand the availability of quality community college career technical education and workforce development courses, programs, pathways, credentials, certificates, and degrees.

The SWP legislation requires each consortium to submit a plan to the chancellor's office that includes an analysis of regional labor market needs informed by a federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act economic analysis and other sources as applicable. Consortia plans must also include measurable regional goals that align with the performance accountability measures of the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, and an inventory of regionally prioritized and locally prioritized projects and programs that close relevant labor market and employment gaps.

To support the colleges and consortia in preparing and implementing their regional plans, the following technical assistance activities will be provided in 2017.
