Setting the Stage

- 30% of 9th graders drop out
- 25% of adults 16 years or older cannot read a newspaper
- California ranks 48/50 in share of adults without HS diploma
- 80% of students who enroll in the community colleges lack basic skills
- 49/42% of jobs in California pre-recession are "middle-skill" jobs. Largest share of future openings
- 58% of the people in the 2020 workforce were already working in 2005
- By 2020 60% of California's workforce will be from populations with historically low levels of educational attainment
- 40% of residents 18 years or older highest level of education is a HS diploma (SDNC)
