Have you ever Thought About Serving at the State Level?

Here are some thoughts we hope will encourage you to volunteer to serve at the state level.

Why should I volunteer?

- ☆ Because service to faculty across the state is important to us all
- ☆ Because your district, your college, your department will benefit from your experience
- ☆ Because you and your students can personally benefit from your participation
- ☆ Because you can enhance your leadership skills and make new contacts throughout California
- ☆ Because it is exciting to be a part of participatory governance and policy-making at this level
- ☆ Because it is just plain fun to be associated with others who care so much about community college students and our profession!

How often does the State-level Group meet?

- ☆ Varies—some groups meet as little as once a year and others meet once a month.

How can I schedule these activities when I'm so busy on my own campus?

- ☆ Participating at the State level can often inform your work at the local level.
- ☆ Besides, we all know what they say about "busy" people attracting additional responsibilities because they can handle them. The rewards are well worth it!

Do I have to be involved in my local senate to volunteer?

- ☆ While local senate experience is useful for our work, it is not necessary. You can still volunteer to serve on any one of our committees.

What kind of talents and skills should I bring?

- ☆ Committees work best when members bring a wide range of interests and abilities: we need the views of counselors, occupational educators, librarians, discipline and cross-discipline faculty.
- ☆ All members, though, should be committed to working, willing to read materials with care, respond promptly to requests, whether from the office or the field, and represent accurately the views and adopted positions of the Academic Senate.

Where do committees meet and are there funds to cover travel?

- ☆ Committees meet both in person and via conference call. When meeting in person, costs for travel are reimbursed.

How will I be notified?

- ☆ Committee chairs contact people during the summer. Be sure to include your home and cell numbers.
- ☆ Other appointments may happen throughout the year and you may be contacted by E-mail and/or phone.

If I submit a Nomination to Serve form, will I be appointed?

- ☆ ASCCC considers a variety of disciplines, skills, and experiences when selecting members, so you may not be appointed to your desired committee. However, do not be discouraged!
- ☆ Get involved on your local campus, network with faculty at Senate events, or volunteer to work with the Senate on some other level if you are not appointed when you first submit your name.
- ☆ Talk to committee chairs about the committee work and your interest, become involved and engaged in discussions locally and statewide, and look for other ways to engage.

How can I get additional information about serving?

- ☆ Talk to any current Executive Committee member about their experiences.
- ☆ Talk to a member of the Outreach and Recruitment Committee.
- ☆ Ask Executive Director Julie Adams to answer your specific questions.
